


To access eBooks:

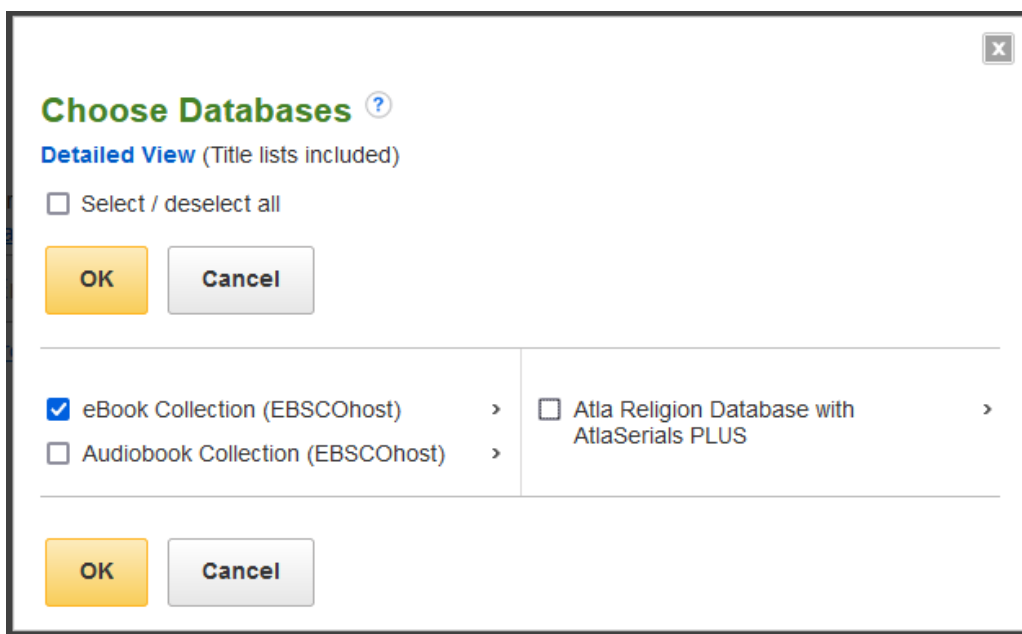




