## First-Month Rituals in Ezekiel's Temple Vision:

A Pentateuchal and Babylonian Comparison

### Abstract

This article examines a number of similarities and differences in the status and roles of functionaries in Ezekiel's vision and the contemporaneous Babylonian celebration of the Akītu festival. Explicit references to the month of Nisan appear in the temple vision: in the date notice (40:1) and with regard to ritual cleansing of the temple (45:18–20), which parallels the time when the festivals for the Babylonian gods were held. Consideration of the Akītu festival exemplifies how Babylonian ritual practices left a strong impression on the Jewish exiles there and, even more so, on the exiles from priestly families. The affinity between the Jewish and Babylonian calendars seems not only to be grounded in administrative needs but also to be extended to the adoption of principles from Babylonian culture.

### Key Words

Akītu festival, Ezekiel, Passover, temple vision, temple functionaries

TWO SPHERES INFORM this consideration of the first-month rituals in Ezekiel's temple vision and the possible source of their unique features: an inner-biblical, especially pentateuchal, comparison and the impact of the Babylonian milieu in which the vision took place, the Akītu festival rituals in particular.<sup>1</sup> Regarding each [End Page 390] source, we will see that Ezekiel took an individual path, grounded in his overriding concern with preserving the sanctity of the future temple.

The inner-biblical comparison reveals the explicit, strong emphasis in the Book of Ezekiel on erecting barriers between the deity and humans in order to preserve sanctity, as reflected by the book's polarities of holy (קדש) and profane (חול), and pure (טהר) and defiled (טמא). These overarching themes in Ezekiel receive

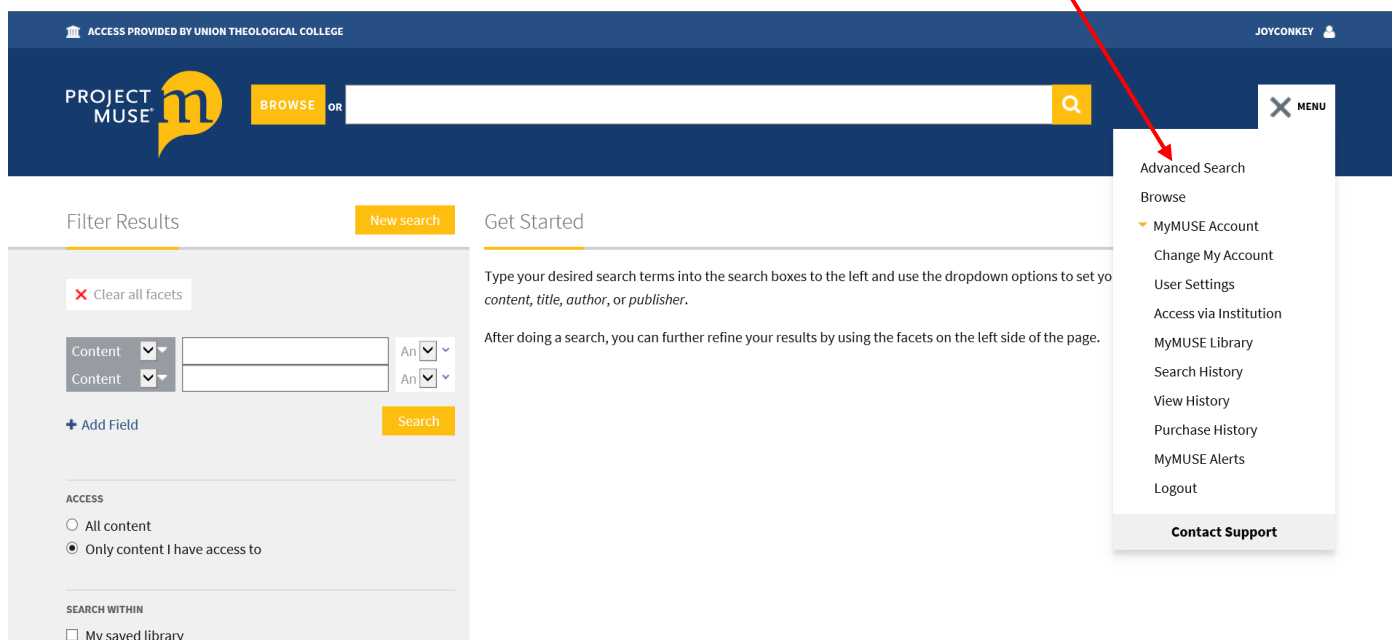



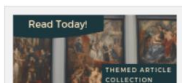

#### ABSTRACT

A challenging biblical passage is the narrative of Jephthah and his daughter in the Book of Judges. The consensus of the exegetical tradition is that in fulfillment of a rash vow, Jephthah sacrificed his daughter as a burnt offering. Yet some early Reformation exegetes argued instead that she entered into a life of dedication to the Lord. They argued on the basis of the grammar of Jephthah's vow, a point which they found in one strand of rabbinical tradition. However, there developed a counter-argument reaffirming the patristic and medieval consensus, and that appealed to an alternative rabbinical tradition. The present essay will examine the competing arguments found in Protestant commentaries published between c.1530 and c.1650. In the end, the patristic and medieval consensus prevailed, and the alternative reading was rejected; but both sides agreed that the one noble character in this tale was the nameless daughter of Jephthah.
