## How many items can I borrow and for how long?

The number of items you can borrow and the length of time these can be borrowed for depends on your reader category:

| Reader category | Number of <br> standard loan <br> items | Standard loan <br> period | Number of short <br> loan items | Number of 7 day <br> loan items |
| :--- | :--- | :--- | :--- | :--- |
| Student <br> (maximum number <br> of loan items $=10$ ) | 8 | 28 days | 2 | 2 |
| Annual member | 8 | 28 days | 0 | 0 |
| Life member <br> Research student <br> (PhD or postgrad <br> dissertation <br> stage) | 16 | 28 days | 0 | 0 |
| Research member | 16 | 84 days | 0 | 0 |
| Staff | 84 days | 0 | 0 |  |

Two audio visual items can be borrowed by students and five by research students.

Borrowing periods for undergraduate students for different loan types are:

| Loan type | Borrowing period |
| :--- | :--- |
| Standard loan | 28 days |
| Short loan | 2 days |
| 7 day loan | 7 days |
| Reference only | Non-borrowable |

Borrowing periods are slightly longer for students officially classed as having special needs.

Standard loan books can be renewed once by students, annual and life members. Staff, research students and research members can renew items up to three times.

Only standard loan items which are on loan can be reserved. If a standard loan item is reserved by another library member, the loan period will be reduced to one week. That is, after the borrower has had the reserved item for one week they will be asked to return it.


Ask Library staff if you wish to see short or 7 day loans as these are kept behind the issue desk. Make sure you know the book title and class number of each short or 7 day loan you need. It is a good idea to write these details down and bring them with you.
