



What is Huntington Library Quarterly (HLQ) and where do I access it?

Huntington Library Quarterly is a journal which publishes research articles about the history, literature and art of Britain and America from the sixteenth century to the eighteenth century. Articles can be essays, notes and documents. Book reviews, review articles and special issues are also published in HLQ.

The *HLQ* can be accessed in the 'Student Resources'/'Library Resources' section of the VLE or in the 'Digital Resources from the Gamble Library' section of each shell under 'E-journals':







You can also access the *HLQ* using the PDF Gamble Guide listing all electronic resources which is emailed out by the Librarian.

Once you click on the 'Huntington Library Quarterly' icon you will be prompted to enter your Union Theological College email address and password. You will then be redirected to the HLQ landing page.


Simple searching within HLQ

Searched for: the term [justification] in title




Advanced searching within HLQ

From the menu on the right of the screen select 'Advanced search.'





Make sure you select 'Huntington Library Quarterly' from the list given so you only get articles from this journal. Otherwise, you will see a range of content which you may or may not have access to.




Now think of keywords relevant to the topic you want to find articles on and search:

MyMUSE Library

Creating a MyMUSE Library account will allow you to save articles and searches to your personal account set up journal alerts. Click 'Menu' and 'Log In / Sign Up':



Scroll down to complete the form if you have not signed up before:








Clicking on 'MyMUSE Library' on the left of the screen or in the Menu will let you see all saved articles.






You can cite items, delete some or all saved items from MyMUSE Library. Clicking on 'Menu' and 'Search History' will bring up all that you have searched for while logged in. You can choose to delete some, or all, of the searches:




To create a journal alert so you are emailed each time a new journal issue is released, go into the main record for the journal and click '+MUSE Alert.'





You will be redirected to another page where you can select how (by email etc.) and how often you are contacted when a new journal issue is released:



Clicking 'Add This Alert' will save the alert.

Any Alerts you have set can be seen and edited under 'MyMUSE Alerts.'

Click on 'Logout' when you have finished using the platform.
