## Student Representatives



As students, you have a voice in your own education. Please make it heard by talking to your relevant student representatives who participate in various College committees and forums. You can also raise issues with members of the General Student Council or the Ministerial Students' Council. And when opportunity arises, be ready to take on a role where you can be the student representing your peers.

## Annual College Survey



Every spring the College conducts an anonymous survey allowing you to provide feedback on your College experience, giving you a chance to have your say and shape the future of the College. Your feedback on your student experience really matters and is reviewed by the Education Committee.

## Module and Programme Review



Make sure to complete module and tutor reviews at the end of each module (available on the VLE). This process is used to inform the reports submitted to the Faculty's module and programme reviews. Student representatives contribute to these meetings which are held at the end of each semester in order to enhance and develop the College's provision. The results of the annual programme review are published in the relevant category of Student Resources on the VLE.

## Periodic Review



This wide-ranging review is conducted every three years and includes a student panel member. Students are invited to meet the review team and to provide feedback.

## Focus Groups



On an ad hoc basis students and alumni are invited to engage with a range of topics to provide in-depth and specific feedback about various aspects of student experience.
